³For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. ⁴For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, ⁵so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. ⁶Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them, in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Luke 2:42-52

⁴²[At that time:] When Jesus was twelve years old, they went up according to custom. ⁴³And when the feast was ended, as they were returning, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem. His parents did not know it, ⁴⁴but supposing him to be in the group they went a day's journey, but then they began to search for him among their relatives and acquaintances, ⁴⁵and when they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem, searching for him. ⁴⁶After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. ⁴⁷And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. ⁴⁸And when his parents saw him, they were astonished. And his mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us so? Behold, your father and I have been searching for you in great distress." ⁴⁹And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" ⁵⁰And they did not understand the saying that he spoke to them. ⁵¹And he went down with them and came to Nazareth and was submissive to them. And his mother treasured up all these things in her heart.



SERMON ON ROMANS 12:1-6A



GIVING OUR BODY AND MIND FOR CHRIST AND ONE ANOTHER

Sermon Outline

1. We are one body in Christ!

Rom. 12:4-5 "For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another."

Rom. 12:1 "...present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship"

Rom. 12:2 "be transformed by the renewal of your mind"

Rom. 12:6 "Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them."

- 2. Give your body as a living sacrifice.
- Give your mind, renewed by God's Word.
- 4. Exercise your body and mind so you're ready to serve.

DOCTRINE FOR THE DAY – EXERCISES OF FAITH

Our Confessions teach that the true "exercises" and "sacrifices" that God desires aren't empty works but the spiritual exercises of faith. This includes, as seen below, praise, prayer, confession, suffering, selfcontrol, etc:

From the Apology to the Augsburg Confession, Article XV: Human Traditions

And of the mortification of the flesh and discipline of the body we thus teach, just as the Confession states, that a true and not a feigned mortification occurs through the cross and afflictions by which God exercises us (when God breaks our will, inflicts the cross and trouble]. In these we must obey God's will, as Paul says, Rom. 12:1: "Present your bodies a living sacrifice." And these are the spiritual exercises of fear and faith. ⁴⁶ But in addition to this mortification which occurs through the cross [which does not depend upon our will] there is also a voluntary kind of exercise necessary, of which Christ says, Luke 21:34: Take heed to yourselves lest at any time your hearts be overcharged with surfeiting. And Paul, 1 Cor. 9:27: I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection, etc. ⁴⁷ And these exercises are to be undertaken not because they are services that justify, but in order to curb the flesh, lest satiety may overpower us, and render us secure and indifferent, the result of which is that men indulge and obey the dispositions of the flesh.

From the Apology to the Augsburg Confession, Article XXIV: The Mass

Now the rest are eucharistic sacrifices, which are called sacrifices of praise, Lev. 3:1f.; 7:11f.; Ps. 56:12f., namely, the preaching of the Gospel, faith, prayer, thanksgiving, confession, the afflictions of saints, yea, all good works of saints....And such are the sacrifices of the New Testament, as Peter teaches, 1 Pet. 2:5: "An holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices."... Paul teaches the same thing Rom. 12:1: "Present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable, which is your reasonable service." Reasonable service signifies, however, a service in which God is known, and apprehended by the mind, as happens in the movements of fear and trust towards God....The Epistle to the Hebrews 13:15, teaches the same thing: "By Him, therefore, let

us offer the sacrifice of praise to God continually"; and he adds the interpretation, that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to His name. He bids us offer praises, i.e., prayer, thanksgiving, confession, and the like.
