Exodus 8:16-24

¹⁶[In those days:] The LORD said to Moses, "Say to Aaron, 'Stretch out your staff and strike the dust of the earth, so that it may become gnats in all the land of Egypt." ¹⁷And they did so. Aaron stretched out his hand with his staff and struck the dust of the earth, and there were gnats on man and beast. All the dust of the earth became gnats in all the land of Egypt. ¹⁸The magicians tried by their secret arts to produce gnats, but they could not. So there were gnats on man and beast. ¹⁹Then the magicians said to Pharaoh, "This is the finger of God." But Pharaoh's heart was hardened, and he would not listen to them, as the LORD had said.





SERMON ON LUKE 11:14-28



"STRONGER"

Sermon Outline

- 1. The Problem: Satan and his demonic horde.
 - a. "When a strong man, fully armed, guards his own palace, his goods are safe..."
- 2. The Answer: Jesus the Stronger Man and His Nike (victory)
 - a. "But when one stronger than he attacks him and overcomes him, he takes away his armor in which he trusted and divides his spoil."
- 3. The Warning: No neutral ground.
 - a. "Whoever is not with me is against me, and whoever does not gather with me scatters. When the unclean spirit has gone out of a person, it passes through waterless places seeking rest, and finding none it says, 'I will return to my house from which I came.' And when it comes, it finds the house swept and put in order. Then it goes and brings seven other spirits more evil than itself, and they enter and dwell there. And the last state of that person is worse than the first."
- 4. The Prescription: Fully Armed and Guarded!
 - a. "Blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and keep it!"

DOCTRINE FOR THE DAY (From Small Catechism)

The Sixth Petition

And lead us not into temptation.

What does this mean?

God tempts no one. We pray in this petition that God would guard and keep us so that the devil, the world, and our sinful nature may not deceive us or mislead us into false belief, despair, and other great shame and vice. Although we are attacked by these things, we pray that we may finally overcome them and win the victory.

The Seventh Petition

But deliver us from evil.

What does this mean?

We pray in this petition, in summary, that our Father in heaven would rescue us from every evil of body and soul, possessions and reputation, and finally, when our last hour comes, give us a blessed end, and graciously take us from this valley of sorrow to Himself in heaven.

283. How does God help us to resist those threats?

He provides us with the Word of Christ, the Holy Spirit, Baptism, Absolution, the Lord's Supper, and the gift of prayer as armor and weapons.

- 948 Romans 13:14 But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.
- 949 <u>1 Corinthians 10:13</u> No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and He will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation He will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.
- 950 Ephesians 6:11, 17–18 Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. ...
 And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication.

"Change and decay in all around I see" (LSB 878:4).

Plants which died in the fall decay rapidly in spring. Human beings can die at any time of year, followed by our own decay. The ethical decay around us "stinks to high heaven." Our sinful nature is so decayed that "I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want, that I do" (Rom. 7:8).

But God provides the antidote to decay. Psalm 16:10 expresses our Christian hope: "You will not leave my soul for sheol; You will not allow Your Holy One to see decay." St. Paul (following St. Peter's Pentecost sermon) explained this: "David, after assisting with the plan of God in his own generation, fell asleep and was added to his fathers and saw decay. But He whom God raised [Jesus Christ] did not see decay. So, it should be known to you, brothers, that through Him forgiveness of sins is announced to you; and from all things from which you could not be justified in the law of Moses, in Him everyone who believes is justified" (Acts 13:36-39).

The sinless Son of God "died for our sins" (1 Cor. 15:3) "and was raised for our justification" (Rom. 4:25), so that "everyone who believe in Him would not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). "In Him we live and move and exist" (Acts 17:28). "Oh, Thou who changest not, abide with me!"
