
PSALM 23 – SHEPHERD ME, O GOD


SERMON ON JOHN 10:11-16

"The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. He who is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them."



"SHEEP AREN'T CHEAP"

- 1. What does the word good mean in "good shepherd"?
- 2. Hired hands are prone to thinking sheep are cheap. But not Jesus.
 - a. What are times we have treated God's sheep as cheap and have run away when the wolf has come?
- 3. Jesus *knows* His sheep like a father knows a son.
- 4. Look at the whole picture: The Church is the flock. Jesus is the Gate (see Nicanor Gate below) and the true Shepherd. His voice is the Holy Scriptures.



DOCTRINE FOR THE DAY – WHY USE THE LITURGY?

We use liturgical worship in the Lutheran church because it keeps us focused on Christ and what He gives rather than on our own hearts or feelings. Jesus gives us His Word and His Sacrament (*the main thing*) and then we respond with praise, prayer, and thanksgiving.

A special benefit of using the liturgy is the memorization of Scripture. The liturgy is packed with words right from God's Word that we commit to heart when we learn the liturgy. For example, see all the Scripture references below for the liturgy of Divine Service 1, page 151 in the LSB:


